



Exhibitors are responsible for the correct description of their exhibits and for ensuring they are entered in the correct classes.

MEMBERSHIP

Exhibitors who wish to become members should **apply directly** to the Membership Secretary (see application form below) with the required fee, as soon as possible. If the application is accepted by the Committee **a minimum of one week** before the Show, the difference in entry fees will be refunded and included in the admittance envelope on Show day.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

(All definitions apply to shows held under GCCF Rules)

OPEN CLASSES	see details on page 12. (Must be GCCF Registered)
CATS	Not less than 9 calendar months on the day of the show
KITTENS	Not less than 14 weeks and under 9 calendar months on the day of the Show, Neuter kittens are entered in kitten open & miscellaneous classes and compete for BIS Kitten. Neuter kittens of Provisional Breeds should be included in Kitten Intermediate classes where separate classes for Adult, Kitten and Neuter are scheduled
NEUTER ADULTS	Neutered adults may only enter Neuter Classes and may not compete with entire cats or kittens except in Club Classes which are scheduled to include Neuters. Where Best in Show is held, the best Neuter shall be considered against the best Entire Adult and Kitten for Best Exhibit in Show
NOVICE	Exhibits that have not won a First Prize in any class at a show held under GCCF Rules
LIMIT	Exhibits that have not won more than four First Prizes in any class at a show held under GCCF Rules
SPECIAL LIMIT	Exhibits that have won more than four First Prizes in any class at a show held under GCCF Rules
DEBUTANTE	Exhibits that have never been shown at a show held under GCCF rules. (If Debutante Adult and Neuter classes are offered at a show, entry as a Debutante Kitten does not count when the exhibit is shown as an Adult or Neuter and entry as a Debutante Adult or Kitten does not count when the exhibit is neutered and shown)
MAIDEN	Exhibits that have not won a First, Second or Third Prize in any class at a show held under GCCF Rules
BREEDERS	Exhibits bred by exhibitor/s. Cats originally registered in the Breeders' Joint ownership but changed to single ownership of one of the Breeders can still be entered in this class. Cats originally registered in the Breeder's single ownership and changed to joint ownership with the Breeder should be entered in the Non-Breeders Class
ADOLESCENT	Cats over 9 months of age and under 15 months on the day of the show
JUNIOR	Cats over 9 calendar months of age and under 2 years on the day of the show
SENIOR	Cats 2 years and over on the day of the show
VETERAN	Cats 7 years and over on the day of the show
ARISTOCRAT	Exhibits that have won one or more Challenge/Premier Certificates but have not achieved Champion/Premier status
RADIUS	Exhibits that live within a 25 mile radius of the show hall
VISITOR	Exhibits that live over 25 miles from the show hall
INTERMEDIATE	For provisional breeds only
OCIPET CLASS	Lots of us have them. Loveable layabouts, but maybe not perfect enough for the Ocicat Breed Classes. We don't mind if there is a chewed ear, or the spots have gone to sleep, or they are no longer "athletic and powerful, graceful and lithe". Temperament, condition and presentation (well groomed?) are what count. The winner of the Club Class will become the <u>Club Champion Ocipet</u> . And if they win again next year they will become Club Grand Champion Ocipets. There is a Class for Ocipet Kittens too.

NOTE:-

The status of the exhibit for entering restricted classes (i.e. Maiden, Limit etc shall be the cat's status on the date of entry, except where Section 2, Rule 15e regarding entry into Grand Classes applies. The wins as a Kitten do not count when the exhibit is shown as an Adult or Neuter; the wins as an Adult do not count when the exhibit is neutered and shown. Merit Awards do not count as wins for entering restricted class.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

This Show is held under Licence granted by the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy, and is therefore subject to the Rules of the Council. A copy of the Rules may be obtained from the GCCF, 5 Kings Castle Business Park, The Drove, Bridgwater TA6 4AG, or from the GCCF website. All Exhibitors should be aware of the Regulations contained within Section 4 of the Rules; ignorance will not be accepted as an excuse for breach of the Rules.

SHOW ENTRY

It is your responsibility to ensure that the correct details, taken from either the Registration or Transfer Form, are given for your Exhibits, and that they are entered in the correct Classes. Where an Exhibit is jointly owned, **either** party may sign the declaration. Entries will not be accepted without the correct Fees; or with post dated cheques. Cheques should be made payable to Merseyside Cat Club. The Club will charge the Exhibitor for any Fees incurred from their Bank, due to Cheques not being honoured. You are **strongly recommended**, to send in a stamped address Postcard or Envelope, for confirmation of receipt of your Show Entry, and bring it with you on show day.

VETTING IN

Vetting In slips will be given out at the entrance to Vetting In. All exhibits must be presented to a Veterinary Surgeon for examination, between 8.00 a.m. and 9.45 a.m., prior to being penned. Please have the exhibits vaccination certificate ready to show to the veterinary surgeon.

All cats exhibited at this Show, which is held under GCCF Rules, must have a current certificate of vaccination against FIE, FVR and FCV ("cat flu").

The full primary course (first set of vaccinations) in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations must have been completed more than seven days before the Show.

Booster vaccinations against FIE, FVR and FCV must be given at the manufacturer's recommended intervals. Where a variable interval of 1 – 3 years for FCV and FHV is recommended the minimum interval applies. i.e. all cats attending shows **MUST** receive annual booster vaccinations against FCV and FHV.

For Boosters only, note: Exhibitors are advised to leave at least a week between a booster vaccination and show attendance to allow the vaccine to take effect and in case of any adverse reaction.

Cats without a valid vaccination certificate will be rejected under Section A of the Veterinary Rejection form, unless the exhibitor undertakes to provide proof of vaccination, valid for the show, by sending the certificate to the GCCF Office within seven days of the Show. Failure to do so will lead to disqualification from this Show and the cat's name will be placed on the veterinary rejection list until proof of vaccination is received in the Office.

PLEASE NOTE: Homeopathic vaccinations are not acceptable for the purpose of showing.

Any Exhibit rejected at Vetting In, depending on the reason for rejection, may either be taken home, or placed in a Quarantine Pen away from the other Exhibits. If, in the Veterinary Surgeon's opinion, it is desirable for any other Exhibits from the same household, and/or in contact exhibits; and/or the owners/agents to be debarred from the Show, this will be enforced.

Cats which show obvious signs of lack of attention to hygiene, have sharp untrimmed claws or in the opinion of the veterinary surgeons are in an unfit condition to show, must be rejected under Section A of the Veterinary Rejection form. Note: Exhibitors should be allowed the opportunity to trim claws prior to rejection but should not expect the veterinary surgeons to do this for them at vetting

The Duty Veterinary Surgeons decision is final.

COUNTERSIGNATURES

In the event of a change of Judge of a Breed Class occurring after the closing date of the show, **providing the exhibitor informs the Show Manager prior to Judging**, that a certificate has previously been awarded by the replacement Judge, the Show Managers shall appoint one other Judge who shall Judge the cat, and if the cat is considered worthy, countersign the certificate which shall then count towards Champion/Premier status.

If the replacement Judge at the first show has also previously been booked for a subsequent show, the closing date of which is before the date of the first show and where the actual entry has been made and received before the date of the first show, then at the subsequent show this Judge can be regarded as a replacement Judge for the purpose of requesting a counter-signature.

CHAMPIONS AND PREMIERS

The title of Champion for cats and Premier for Neuters shall be granted to exhibits winning three Challenge Certificates or Premier Certificates at three shows under separate Judges. A GCCF Challenge/Premier Certificate will be offered for each cat/neuter Breed Class of the recognised breeds with Championship status.

GRAND CHAMPIONS — GRAND PREMIERS

The title of Grand Champion will be granted to a cat winning three Grand Challenge Certificates at three shows under three different judges. To compete in the Grand Champion Class a cat must be a full Champion. A Champion cat may only be shown in its Grand Champion Class. Only one prize with a Reserve in the case of disqualification will be awarded.

The title of Grand Premier shall be granted to neutered cats under the same rules and conditions as those for Grand Champion.

IMPERIAL GRAND CHAMPIONS – IMPERIAL GRAND PREMIERS

The title of Imperial Grand Champion will be granted to a cat winning five Imperial Grand Champion Challenge Certificates at five shows under five different Judges. To compete in the Imperial Grand Champion Class, cat must be a full Grand Champion. A Grand Champion cat may only be shown the Imperial Grand Champion Class. Only one prize with a Reserve in case of disqualification will be awarded.

The title of Imperial Grand Premier will be awarded to neutered cats under the same rules as those for Imperial Grand Champion.

OLYMPIAN GRAND CHAMPIONS – OLYMPIAN GRAND PREMIERS

The title of Olympian Grand Champion will be granted to a cat winning five Olympian Grand Champion Challenge Certificates at five shows under five different Judges. To compete in the Olympian Grand Champion Class, cat must be a full Imperial Grand Champion. An Imperial Grand Champion cat may only be shown the Olympian Grand Champion Class. Only one prize with a Reserve in case of disqualification will be awarded.

The title of Olympian Grand Premier will be awarded to neutered cats under the same rules as those for Olympian Grand Champion.

NON-PEDIGREE PET

The Non-Pedigree Pet group would be comprised of unregistered cats from unregistered or unknown parents as now. They would be of traditional “moggy” appearance either Long/Semi-Long or Shorthaired. Non-Pedigree pets will be judged for the quality of their Presentation, Condition, Temperament and Personality. All Non-Pedigree pets 6 months and over shall be neutered.

PEDIGREE PET

The Pedigree Pet group will be comprised of cats of pedigree appearance with known or unknown pedigree, full or half pedigree, background.

Pedigree pets will be judged for the quality of their Presentation, Condition, Temperament and Personality. No prefixes or titles shall be used; cats will be entered either by their pet name or, if registered, the rest of the registered name, without the prefix may be used. No reference will be made to breed numbers or descriptions. All pedigree pets 6 months and over shall be neutered

Notes:

- (1) No cat shall be eligible to enter the Olympian, Imperial or Grand classes unless it has achieved the title of Imperial, Grand, Champion or Premier as appropriate on or before the closing date for entries as published in the schedule for the show.
- (2) When counting wins / prizes, include all awarded in any class at a show held under GCCF rules.
- (3) Overseas titles: Cats with titles gained overseas are not eligible to enter Grand Classes at GCCF licensed shows. Overseas titles may be included in brackets at the end of the cats name in the show catalogue.

EXHIBITS FOR ASSESSMENT

Cats, kittens and neuters of those breeds with Preliminary recognition must enter the appropriate Assessment Class, plus up to two applicable Miscellaneous classes. Assessment classes are now competitive and will be split Male / Female and entrants placed against each other. Exhibits meeting the required standard will be awarded Merit Certificates, if these are awarded, BOB will also be awarded. BOB winners will be eligible for consideration for BIS.

Exhibitors must provide a copy of the GCCF approved standard of points when making their entry if not included in the latest GCCF Standard of Points booklet.

NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS

The Committee reserve the right to :

- (a) Appoint other Judges should those advertised be unable to fulfil their engagement; and to appoint further Judges if deemed necessary.
- (b) Cancel, amalgamate or divide Classes.
- (c) Disqualify any Exhibit entered in the wrong Class.
- (d) Refuse a Show Entry, without giving a reason.
- (e) Refuse admission to the Show Hall, without giving a reason.

Exhibitors should also be aware that :

- (a) In the event of an Exhibit being unable to attend the Show due to illness, provided that a Vet's Certificate is received by the Show Manager at least seven days prior to the Show, a refund of 50% of the Entry Fee (excluding Benching Fee) will be made.
- (b) All Exhibitors property is left in the Hall at the owners risk.
- (c) No Exhibitor may remove any official Notice from an Exhibits Pen.
- (d) For Sale signs are not permitted.
- (e) Exhibitors may be liable for the cost of Veterinary treatment required by their Exhibit.
- (f) Details on this entry form will be processed by computer.
- (g) **The Committee STRONGLY recommend that an individual carrier is available under each exhibits Pen.**

PENNING OF EXHIBITS

Once admitted into the Show Hall, no Exhibit may be removed without the permission of the Show Manager. Exhibitors must vacate the penned area of the Hall on commencement of Judging at 10.00 am, **having ensured that their Exhibit and its Pen conform to Show Rules**; and may not return, unless requested, until 12.30 p.m.

The show is scheduled to close at 5pm but **MAY** close earlier at the Show Manager's discretion.

NO CAT MAY BE REMOVED FROM ITS PEN PRIOR TO THIS TIME, other than by Judges, Stewards, the Duty Vet or a MCC Official. Exceptionally, the Show Management may give permission for early removal from the Show, if a prior written request has been received or if there are specific "emergency" circumstances on the day. **Please** do not ask for early withdrawal, because you have a long journey home!

ENTERING THIS SHOW MEANS YOU AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THIS RULE.

MASTER CAT TITLE

The title Master Cat (MC) shall be attained by the awarding of three Master Cat certificates by three different judges at participating GCCF Championship shows.

GRAND MASTER CAT TITLE

The title Grand Master Cat (GMC) shall be attained by the awarding of three Grand Master Cat certificates by three different judges at participating GCCF Championship Shows.

IMPERIAL GRAND MASTER CAT TITLE


The title Imperial Grand Master Cat (IGM) shall be attained by the awarding of five Imperial Grand Master Cat certificates by five different judges at participating GCCF Championship Shows.

OLYMPIAN MASTER CAT TITLE

The Olympian title shall be attained by the awarding of five Olympian certificates by 5 different judges at participating Championship or Sanction GCCF shows. Only one certificate is allowed at one breed show at each level. The first five awards will be noted with the title Olympian Bronze, the 2nd five will be noted with the title of Olympian Silver and the 3rd five will be noted with the title of Olympian Gold (total fifteen certificates to reach Olympian Gold).

THE OCICAT CLUB

CODE of ETHICS

This Code is to be used as a guideline for behaviour expected from Members of The Ocicat Club

The purpose of this code is to protect the welfare of the Ocicat by maintaining high standards in breeding and ethics

Please Note: Where this code refers to the 'Ocicat breed', this shall include all Ocicat variants and permitted outcross progeny that come under the jurisdiction of The Ocicat Club

1. Respect for the breed

The Member shall respect the wild beauty, intelligence, and friendly interactive nature of the Ocicat. The primary concern for the Member shall be the current and future welfare of the Ocicat breed. Members shall maintain their cats in good condition and good health at all times. Breeder Members shall undertake, as far as reasonably practical, to place kittens only into homes where they will be loved, appreciated and well cared for. These Members shall breed only for the betterment of the Ocicat breed.

2. Accurate Representation

Breeder Members shall be professional in all dealings with prospective kitten owners and shall take great effort to ensure that any potential owner fully understands the Ocicat breed, including its merits, personality and needs. All Members shall show integrity, honesty and accuracy in all appraisals of cats, pedigrees and health. Breeder Members shall discuss clearly with any potential owner the terms of sale. If the kitten is to be sold as a pet, the new owner must receive a full explanation of all the implications of a kitten being registered on the non-active register.

3. Agreements and Certification

Members shall not sell, lease or give any cat or kitten to any pet shop, research facility or similar. Breeder Members shall register or declare all kittens with the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy (GCCF) or other appropriate body and provide the new owner with registration papers, an accurate pedigree document along with full health records upon collection of a cat or kitten. Breeder Members shall only use Ocicats, Abyssinians, and their variants registered with a recognised registration body for breeding. At the time of sale Breeder Members shall provide the new owner with a completed and signed transfer of ownership form (if available), unless it is agreed in writing by both parties not to do so (e.g. if the transfer document has not yet been received, or is to be withheld until proof of neutering is provided). Where agreements are made between two parties in writing, all Members shall adhere to the terms and conditions to which they have agreed. Kittens should be in obvious good health and fully inoculated (minimum cat flu and enteritis) when they leave the breeder.

***Recommendations:** It is recommended to all Members that any agreements are put in writing and signed by both parties, making clear any terms and conditions that have been agreed to. These may include, but are not limited to, the purchasing or selling of any cats or kittens, any restrictions of use for breeding cats, terms for a mating agreement to include any restrictions to apply to the progeny, stud fees, neutering agreements, etc.*

Breeder Members are further advised that any contracts or agreements should be signed prior to accepting payment. It is recommended that all kittens are micro chipped prior to sale and protected by free initial insurance cover. Queens should not be allowed to have more than three litters in any two-year period, with a minimum of 19 weeks between litters (as recommended by GCCF). Novice breeders should not sell kittens for breeding before seeking advice from an experienced breeder, similarly they should seek advice in both finding a suitable stud, and caring for a pregnant queen and kittens (advice and support for novice breeders is always available through The Ocicat Club).

4. Integrity, Ethics and Professional Standards

All Members shall maintain their animals in a sanitary and safe environment, with the support of regular care from a licensed veterinarian. Members shall maintain appropriate immunisation protection for all animals in their care and provide well for both their physical and emotional welfare. Breeder Members shall breed in accordance with veterinary and GCCF recommendations* for the purpose of improving the breed. When showing their cats all Members shall abide by the show rules of the Associations with which their cats are registered, and not malign any judges or fellow competitors. Members shall not engage in false or misleading advertising of the Ocicat Breed, or make false, misleading or degrading statements about any cats, breeders, or member's individual practices or character. Members shall conduct themselves at all times in such a manner as to reflect credit on the ownership of Ocicats in particular (e.g. misuse of any media, written or electronic, by publishing details of, or commenting on Cat Clubs or other people without specific permission could be considered to discredit the Ocicat)

***Recommendation:** Any Member who has a genuine grievance is invited to bring the matter to the attention of the Committee where it will be given full consideration*

All Members shall maintain the integrity of The Ocicat Club by conducting themselves in a professional and ethical manner at all times. In any activity involving the ownership, breeding, sale and exhibition of Ocicats, all Members shall act with this code in mind and adhere to its principles

5. Breach of Ethics

Any Member who appears in breach of this Code of Ethics will be expected to explain their actions to the Committee when the matter is investigated. Any Member found to be in breach of The Ocicat Club Code of Ethics may face disciplinary action from The Ocicat Club and from any other regulatory body to which the breach may concern. At the Committee's discretion, any serious violation may lead to the members' suspension or expulsion from the club in accordance with The Ocicat Club Constitution and Rules.

6. Amendments to the Code of Ethics

Proposed amendments to the Code of Ethics should be forwarded to the Committee for consideration at the next Committee meeting. The Ocicat Club Code of Ethics may be amended by an absolute majority of the Committee or by a simple majority at a General meeting. Any changes implemented by the Committee between AGM's must be ratified at the next Annual General Meeting.
